## Objectives:



1. Increase engagement in lessons
2. Build a rapport between staff and students
3. Increase the amount of progress being made
4. Teachers to implement new strategies in lessons

## Why is this relevant?



School Improvement Plan target - all lessons demonstrate inspiring, challenging and **engaging** lessons.  
Ofsted report - 'students across the school do not make consistently good progress' - is **engagement** a factor?

## Planning and Implementation

- ◆ Select pilot group of staff (8 in total) who teach many different groups
- ◆ Staff to select a group they feel is least engaged
- ◆ Create a questionnaire for all students to fill out
- ◆ Select 3 target students in each class for teachers to focus on
- ◆ Research engagement strategies and get staff to implement in lessons
- ◆ Meet with staff along the way to discuss findings, reflect on the impact so far
- ◆ Students to complete questionnaire again at the end of the project
- ◆ Analyse questionnaires and produce data analysis through graphical representation

## Barriers

- ⇒ Unable to meet with staff due to other school meetings / commitments
- ⇒ Students with low attendance were target students so project had no impact on them
- ⇒ Lost lessons due to other school activities bank holidays
- ⇒ Some staff did not engage with the project as much as I expected

## Next steps

- Carry out over a longer period of time to see if grades are affected
- Role out to the rest of the staff to try within their lessons
- Share best practice with what the pilot group have found with certain students
