

Does increased parental engagement lead to improved pupil progress over time?

It is difficult to measure the qualitative progress due to there not being a control group.....

However, the following has been identified and analysed....

Increase in parents hearing their children read and supporting them at home with 'take home' tasks and 'values' tasks is evident. enrichment

Increased attendance from parents at 'Watch me learn' sessions and 'Stay and Play' sessions each term.

Increased attendance at school events, assemblies and celebrations throughout the year from parents.

Increased number of parents meeting with teachers to discuss provision and targets for specific groups of children.
